The mission of Girls, Inc. is to inspire girls to be strong, smart and bold. Its vision is empowered girls in an equitable society. It is a national non-profit youth organization with roots dating back to 1864, serving 850,000 girls as of 2003. There are 85 Member Organizations, 25 Licensees and 1,501 Sites in US and Canada.
