

2009-2010 CLUB ACTION TEAM POINT SYSTEM

Points will be credited to the Club Action Team (CAT) when the team as a group, or individual members of the team perform actions that generate points according to the system outlined below:

Team Performance Points

1. Monthly Meeting Set-up and Clean-up (all tasks completed by team members) - 2,000 points/month.
2. Responsible Meetings covered by Presenters and Speakers (No Missed Programs) - 3,000 points/month.
3. For successfully completing a Summer/Fall CAT Team Fellowship/Social Event - 15,000 points (75% or better team attendance).
4. For successfully completing a Winter/Spring CAT Team Fellowship/Social Event - 15,000 points (75% or better team attendance).

Individual Team Member Performance Points

1. **Designated Ticket Sales** - 1,000 points for each team member that sells the designated number of tickets for the Ducky Derby and the Boy Scout Pancake Breakfast (2,000 points/team member possible).
2. **Rotary Club of Red Bluff Projects** -1000 points will be earned by each team member that provides service at each of the following events/projects:
 - 4H Judging Project
 - 4 Way Speech Contest
 - Education Day at the Fair
 - Special Olympics
 - School Dictionary Presentations
 - Career Day - Education Foundation
 - Farm Day for 4th Graders
 - Red Bluff Round-Up Beer Sales
 - Chili Cook-Off
 - Boy Scout Super-Bowl Pancake Breakfast
 - Salvation Army Bell Ringing at Christmas
 - Driving or Hosting the GSE Students from UC Davis
 - Attendance at a Red Bluff Interact Club meeting or event
 - Contributing Food to Annual Rotary Food Drive for Salvation Army
 - Contributing a Christmas Gift to Foster Children
 - *Other RB Rotary Sponsored Events as designated by the President
3. **Attendance at Designated Rotary Fellowship Events**
 - a. Attending the District Governors Luncheon - 1,000 points/member in attendance.
 - b. Participating in or assisting in operating the Rotary Golf Tournament - 2,000 points/member.
 - c. Attendance at the Annual Rotary Christmas Party - 2,000 points/member.
 - d. Attendance at the Farm City night Dinner - 1,000 points/member.
 - e. Attendance at the Annual Rotary Sweetheart Luncheon - 1000 points for each spouse or sweetheart attending.
 - f. Attendance at the Past Presidents Luncheon - 1,000 points/member.
4. **Rotary Perfect Attendance Bonus Points**
 - a. The CAT team will be granted 2,000 points for each team member that generates perfect Rotary meeting attendance for a two month period. Points will be granted to the team at the end of each two month period. The Club Secretary will maintain this record. It will be the responsibility of team members to report Rotary Club make-ups of missed meetings to the Secretary.
5. **Rotary Member Recruiting**
 - a. 10,000 points will be credited to the CAT Team when a new Rotarian is inducted into the Red Bluff Rotary Club under the sponsorship of a member of the CAT Team. (5,000 points at induction and 5,000 points on June 1, 2010 for each new member still in the Club.)
6. **Rotary Foundation Activities**
 - a. 3,000 points for each CAT Team member that contributes a classroom set of dictionaries for the 2009-2010 Red Bluff Rotary Club Literacy Project.
 - b. 5,000 points for each member of the CAT Team that is a Paul Harris Sustaining Member for 2009-2010.
 - c. 15,000 points for each new Paul Harris Fellow earned and awarded to a team member or designated family recipient in 2009-2010.
 - d. 1,500 points for every \$100 contributed by CAT Team members to Polio-Plus.

e. 1,500 points for every \$100 contributed by CAT Team members to the International Vision Volunteers (IVV) Project.

7. **District 5160 Events**

- a. 3,000 points for each team member attending the District 5160 Conference in Lake Tahoe.
- b. 2,000 points for each team member attending the District 5160 Assembly in Spring 2010.

Club Goals

7. In cooperation with five to eight other Rotary Clubs, apply for a Rotary District Matching Grant to support and buy equipment for the International Vision Volunteers Eye Surgery Clinic in Zambia operated by member Dr. Bud Tysinger.
8. Increase Rotarian involvement and fellowship through the Club Action Team Competition and Awards BBQ.
9. Contribute \$2,000 to the Polio-Plus Project.
